The CEFRL and “Can-do statements” in Japan – An overview of what these language benchmarks are and how they are being interpreted in education in Japan. Some Comparisons Between English Education in Japan, Korea, China, and Taiwan -- This session outlines how English education in Japan is changing.

Results of a Survey of Student Reading – A recent survey of 398 English department freshmen and sophomores profiles their reading habits, and needs.

Vocabulary Teaching and Assessing – The presenter will describe some of the opportunities for vocabulary learning in our classes and means of assessing them.

IE Program Website: Uploading Files and Content – A “hands-on” session to learn how to upload course outlines, teacher bios, and class photos.
